These grants help support the operations of effective councils and districts that engage people and communities to participate in collaborative, voluntary restoration and protection of native fish or wildlife habitat and natural watershed functions to improve water quality or stream flows.	\$255,623	
Monitoring/Effectiveness Monitoring OWEB grants support a range of monitoring activities, including (but not limited to) baseline monitoring, status and trend monitoring, and effectiveness monitoring. This monitoring helps to document watershed conditions, track changes in critical habitat and species over time, and evaluate the effectiveness of conservation and restoration efforts.	\$17,355
